Anthony S. Nicolosi, Director of the Naval War College Museum, was the keynote speaker. Mr. Nicolosi presented us with an engrossing guided tour through the beginning and background stages of the Naval War College Museum. In so doing he inspired some new thinking regarding the displays and exhibits at our own Beavertail Lighthouse Museum. During his illustrated lecture. Mr. Nicolosi stressed the importance of volunteers and the indispensable role they play. BLMA members. David Clem and Bill Bricker, were cited for their contributions of time, ideas, and actual exhibit items to the War College Museum. We were also impressed by the number of changing exhibits at the museum and the innovative techniques that were used to minimize display costs.

Mr. Nicolosi ended his informative lecture by stating that he feels the two most important functions of a museum are: One - a museum collects and preserves the artifacts of our cultural heritage, and two - a museum educates. In this statement Mr. Nicolosi reaffirms the goal and intent of The Beavertail Lighthouse Museum Association.

PRESIDENT'S AND TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORTS

1997 was a very good year and a very busy year for the Beavertail Lighthouse Museum Association. As mentioned earlier, the museum was host to almost 10, 000 visitors from all over the world. Many of these visitors took advantage of the ever increasing variety of Beavertail offerings at the Gift Shop. The shop is often complimented on the attractiveness of its book selections. Outstanding among these this year was "Seaweed Their Pasture," by Kit Wright, of which over one hundred copies were donated by the Wright Family. Another winner was the children's book, "Mr. Rat." Anyone

who has read this tale written and donated by Peter Frazier knows why it so quickly sold out. Sales of a newly introduced, colorful lighthouse pin, with a flashing red light were so surprising that the manufacturer has offered to design a special Beavertail Pin, if we supply the picture! The addition of the Harbour Lights' Model of Beavertail, a genuine collector's item, has likewise created still another unique memento for Beavertail visitors.

Museum volunteers staffed sales booths at the Conanicut Island Art Association Christmas Sale and at the Jamestown Ferry Days exhibit this summer. Beavertail merchandise sales at both events were very gratifying. Sincere thanks to all those who staffed sales booths at these important fund raising events, as well as the many volunteers who work behind the scenes or at the museum itself. It can't be said enough, "We couldn't do it without you!".

We also could not have done it without Volunteer Coordinator, Bill McCraw. His is a job that requires patience, organizational skills, and yes, coordination. Imagine having to staff the museum for an average of 120 days, twice a day. It is an awesome task and one he has done exceptionally well.

Thanks to another Champlin Foundation Grant of twelve thousand dollars, the Lens Room and Fireplace/Exhibit Room have been refurbished. The entire interior, including upstairs, has been painted and the floors have been recoated. RISE Engineering has insulated the attic, sealed outside surfaces and air leaks and installed interior storm windows. This has resulted in a decrease in our heating oil bill.

It is interesting to note that the number of LIFETIME MEMBERS has doubled since this category was first introduced. At this time total membership receipts are somewhat less than 1996 although we anticipate income will exceed prior years in view of the announced incentive plan which extends the expiration date to the end of 1998. (Wouldn't now be a good time to renew if you haven't already done so? The form on the next page makes it very simple to do so!)

The year 1999 marks the 250th Anniversary of the Beavertail Lighthouse. Much of the work we have done to date will serve us well in planning this event but there is much more to be done. The volunteers and Board of Directors is looking forward to meeting this challenge!




ON THE HORIZON.....


